

## The Chance of a Lifetime



The Uniroyal Fun Cup, Europe's leading endurance race series is holding one of motorsport's most thrilling competitions: the Fun Cup Scholarship. Owner of JPR Motorsport and Series Director Paul Rose, is giving the chance of a lifetime for one hopeful, to share the excitement and drama of long distance endurance racing with a team of 3 like-minded drivers for the entire 2007 UK season, free of charge\*! It is a tremendous opportunity for any novice who has dreamt of being a racing driver, but could see no way in.

The competition is open to anyone with a UK driving licence and to make it fair, no-one in possession of an MSA car race licence is eligible to enter. It consists of three rounds held exclusively at a leading UK race circuit, with one-to-one tuition from a professional race instructor at each round. Rounds one and two are for the small fee of £199 each, with a free grand final.

For round one, hopefuls will be briefed and then enjoy several sessions behind the wheel of a saloon car whilst given expert advice on racing lines, braking points and throttle control as they go round. Those who impress the most will be invited under no obligation to take part in round two. Round two will see more of the same, but there will be more track sessions, so more seat time in one of our saloon cars and more one-to-one tuition. A positive attitude, determination and good character will be expected to shine through: competition will be more intense. The top ten most impressive drivers will be invited back to take part in the grand final.

For the grand final, drivers will experience the thrill of driving one of the Fun Cup enduro cars. The race cars are built to a single specification, powered by a 130bhp VW/Audi engine encased in a Beetle style body. All major units are sealed and no modifications permitted, keeping costs low. At the end of the final, the lucky winner of the Fun Cup Scholarship prize 2007 will be announced.

They will then spend the day at a UK race track undergoing their ARDs test. From here, they will walk away with their National B race licence and become a fully-fledged racer in the Fun Cup 2007. All their kit, helmet and overalls will be provided.

For their 2007 season they will have exclusive testing before every race, for a series which provides an unrivalled amount of track time. The 2007 season will consist of 5 events at leading UK circuits and each event will be between 3 – 5 hours long. Hospitality will even be provided for the lucky scholarship winner and one guest throughout the season. They will also be interviewed and given some useful media skills training by the Sky Sports team that film every race. Indeed, each race will be broadcast on Sky Sports and throughout the world. All other finalists will be given a free entry into Round 1 of the following year's scholarship competition. Plus each of the ten finalists will receive complementary tickets for all of the 2007 Fun Cup races.

Paul Rose, Series Director said, "This competition could be a life changing experience for the winner. There is no competition like it; to be put through an ARDs test and to have exclusive testing and racing for a full season for free is an amazing prize and who knows what opportunities it could lead to for the winner."
